

Supplies for Grade 2 2010-2011

To parents of children entering Grade 2:

In addition to the classroom supplies that we will provide for your child's use at school, please have your child bring all of the following supplies. **All supplies should be brought to the classroom by the end of the first week of school.** They will be stored at school, ready for your child's use.

*****Please ensure that all items are clearly labeled with your child's name.**

Some of the supplies on the list can/should be purchased at the PTA Shop, and are usually cheaper than the local price.

1 box of 12	Colored Pencils
1 box of 24	Crayons
1	Pencil case
1	Sun Hat
2	Glue Sticks
2	Water bottles (one for outside, one for classroom)
1	heavy duty reusable plastic cup
1	heavy duty reusable plastic plate
1 pkg	3" by 5" ruled index cards
4	Notebooks, spiral bound, primary lined paper (the kind with the dotted line through the middle) YOU WILL NOT FIND THESE IN THE PTA SHOP OR IN ZAMBIA.
	<u>Available from PTA Shop (usually cheaper than locally):</u>
5	Erasers
20	#2 Pencils with erasers
1	Pencil Sharpener
100	Plastic Sleeves to go in ring binder, A4
1	Waterproof Library Book Bag

If you choose to purchase some of your supplies overseas, please keep in mind that AIS uses A4 paper, and binders, filler paper, plastic sleeves, etc, should be A4. U.S. Letter size paper is not the same as A4.

To ensure consistency, the following items should be purchased from the PTA Shop:

1	2-Ring Binder, A4
1	Document Envelope, A4
4	Pocket Folders

Students whose first language is not English will need a paper translation dictionary. It should be age-appropriate and in 2 sections - Mother Tongue to English, and English to Mother Tongue. These dictionaries are not available to buy in Zambia so it is very important they are purchased in the home country before departure.

Rulers (12"/30cm), scissors and calculators will be available for your child's use in the classroom, but they may bring their own.
