

## GENERAL SUPPLIES LIST FOR GRADE 8

**All secondary students are advised to purchase these general school supplies. They are used on a regular basis in many classes; some may need to be replenished depending on the student's rate of usage.**

It is compulsory for every student from the 6<sup>th</sup> grade to the 10<sup>th</sup> grade to have an A4 size sketchbook, Landscape Spiral bound, preferably with a Hard Cover. In the previous years the students have been using an A3 size sketchbook which has been quite difficult for them to work in and the books tear very quickly.

The students should bring the following items to all their Visual Art classes

- **PE Lessons** – it is compulsory for students to buy a swim cap for the water polo and swimming units
- \* **After-school activities:** Students who intend to play soccer and field hockey will need to purchase shin guards. (It is advisable to buy these outside of Zambia, as the shops in Zambia do not always have an adequate supply). \*\*\*If your child intends to play **rugby and field hockey** then they are encouraged to buy a mouth/gum guard. It is advisable to buy these outside of Zambia.

**NOTE: Students whose 1<sup>st</sup> language is not English will need a paper translation dictionary. It should be age-appropriate and in 2 sections - home language to English and English to home language. It needs to be purchased in the home country before departure, as such dictionaries are not available in English.**
