AISL Merit Scholarship Mathematics Assignment for the Child

The goal of this task is to assess your presentation skills, your communication skills, your problem-solving skills, your analytical and deductive reasoning skills, your research skills, and your ability to apply what you have learned so far in your maths classes to a real-life context.

Assignment: How Many Calories are Consumed in a Lifetime?

"Calories are units of energy that a food or drink provides. You can usually find calorie counts listed on food items. Certain foods, such as fatty, fried, or processed foods, tend to have more calories. Other foods, such as fresh fruit and vegetables, tend to have fewer calories. However, some healthy fruits and vegetables can be high in calories, while low-calorie foods, such as diet soda, don't provide any nutritional value.

We need calories to give us enough energy to move around, stay warm, grow, work, think, and play. Even our blood circulation and digestion need the energy gained from calories in order to function well." (Livescience.com)

Considering the average lifespan of an urban Zambian person, and considering your own lifestyle, estimate how many calories you are likely to consume during your lifetime.

Include in your calculations variations due to celebrations, fasting, holidays, sleep, age, etc.

- Your presentation should be visually attractive, hand-written, made on A4 pages. 2 pages maximum.
- It should include an introduction where you present the problem and explicitly state all the assumptions made in your calculations.
- You need to write down all your calculations, including calculations if you need to convert kilojoules to calories.
- It should include a conclusion where you indicate the possible sources of inaccuracies in your answers and/or the implications of your findings.
- You are encouraged to make small experiments with yourself, keep a food diary, etc. You
 are welcome to approach experts to gain insight into calorie intake, life expectancy, or
 other issues raised by this project.
- This project has to be your own personal work. You should reference the sources of your work where appropriate (e.g., interview with doctors, teachers, family members, articles or books read, etc.).
